## PROCEDURES FOR SUBMITTING MANUSCRIPTS

The Law Review's Editor-in-Chief will carefully review all manuscripts submitted for publication. Only well-written manuscripts offering original legal analyses will be considered for publication. If the Editor-in-Chief selects an author's submission for publication, a member of the Law Review's Editorial Board will contact the author in writing. The author will receive an Author/Journal Agreement. The Law Review's Board and Staff will begin editing the submission only after receiving a properly executed Author/Journal Agreement.

The Law Review typically publishes one Volume per year containing two Issues. The Law Review accepts unsolicited manuscripts on a rolling basis, so interested authors are encouraged to submit their completed manuscripts as soon as possible.

- Please use footnotes instead of endnotes or parenthetical citations.
- Please adhere to the most current version of THE BLUEBOOK: A UNIFORM SYSTEM OF CITATION (Columbia Law Review Ass'n et al. eds., 19th ed. 2010).
- Manuscripts submitted for publication will not be returned.

The Law Review will notify all authors whose manuscripts are not accepted for publication.
